Reflection Before The Service

Romans 2 & 3

Romans 2 – ¹Therefore you have No Excuse (1:20), O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things. ²We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things. ³Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God?

⁴Or do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that **GOD'S KINDNESS IS MEANT TO LEAD YOU TO REPENTANCE?**

¹⁴For when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do what the law requires,... ¹⁵They show that the work of **the law is written on their hearts**, while their **conscience** also bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even excuse them ¹⁶on that day when, according to **my gospel**, God judges **the secrets of men** by Christ Jesus.

²⁸For no one is a Jew who is merely one outwardly, nor is circumcision outward and physical. ²⁹But a Jew is one inwardly, and circumcision is **a matter of the heart, by the Spirit**, not by the letter. His praise is not from man but from God.

Romans 3 - ²³**FOR ALL HAVE SINNED AND FALL SHORT OF THE GLORY OF GOD,** ²⁴and are **JUSTIFIED by his GRACE**, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, **to be received by FAITH**. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might **be just and the justifier** of the one who has **faith in Jesus**.

²⁷**Then what becomes of our boasting?** It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of WORKS? No, but by the law of **FAITH**. ²⁸For we hold that **one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.**
